## BACKGROUND:

The last MAC meeting was held on December 1, 2016. At this meeting, the MAC was updated by staff on the following:

- Recommendations for changes to the Licensed Midwife Annual Report (LMAR). This process continues to move forward.
- Progress of midwifery assistant regulations
- Midwifery Program
- Midwifery Task Force
- Update on Hospital Transfer Form

Regulations required by AB 1308 (Bonilla, Chapter 665, Statutes of 2013), specifically language required by Business and Professions Code Section 2507 (b)(1)(A)(i) and (ii), continue to be stalled due to disagreement between the interested parties as to whether it is appropriate to place a history of prior cesarean delivery on the list of conditions requiring a referral to a physician for consultation and determination that the risk factors presented by the woman's disease or condition are not likely to significantly affect the course of pregnancy or childbirth, prior to the midwife continuing care for a particular client. The meeting of the Midwifery Task Force to discuss this matter is yet to be convened.

The California Association of Licensed Midwives (CALM) gave a presentation regarding their newly formed Quality Care Program, designed to provide licensed midwives with a framework for community standard of care.
