Subject: Quality Review Report – 3rd Quarter of FY 2006/2007

Attached are the guarterly reports of Quality Review issues requested by the Diversion Committee. They include a review of Intakes, Relapses and Releases during the period of January 1, 2007 through March 31, 2007.

INTAKES

A total of 20 physicians contacted the Program during the 3rd Quarter. The following charts reflect the outcomes of contact with these physicians as of March 31, 2007, as well as, other categories of information.

¹ The determination of a participant's status as Chemically Dependent, Dual Disorder, or Mentally III frequently changes as additional information is gathered. Initially, the Program receives self-reported information during the intake process. Additional information, resulting in a change of status, may be received during either the evaluative or formal participation periods from evaluation reports and treatment records.

Table 1: Program Response Times

Table #1 shows the average response times for intakes (excluding physicians in treatment and those delayed in entry into the Program) during this period, as well as the Program's target timeframes, from the date the physician initially contacted the Program to the completion of the major steps of the evaluation process. These steps include the first face-to-face contact with Program staff; the intake interview; the initial urine test; and attendance at the first DEC meeting.
