REQUESTED ACTION:

This report is intended to provide the Members with an update on the Enforcement Program at the Medical Board of California (Board). No action is needed at this time.

EXPERT REVIEWER PROGRAM:

There are currently 876 active experts in the Board's expert database and 292 experts were utilized to review 657 cases from January 1, 2019 through March 31, 2019. (See BRD 7B-13-17.) Additional experts are needed in the following specialties:

- Allergy and Immunology
- Addiction Medicine with added certification in Family Medicine or Internal Medicine or Psychiatry
- Colon/Rectal Surgery
- Dermatology
- Family Medicine
- Gastroenterology
- Neurological Surgery
- Neurology
- Pain Medicine
- Pathology (preferably from the following counties: Orange, Riverside, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, and Ventura)
- Forensic Pathology
- Pediatric Cardiac Surgery
- Pediatric Gastroenterology
- Pediatric Pulmonology
- Pediatric Surgery
- Plastic Surgeons with the following expertise: 1) Neograft hair transplant/FUE transplant; 2) gender reassignment surgical procedure
- Psychiatry (forensic and addiction, and preferably from the following counties: Fresno, Kern, Sacramento, and Tulare)
- Thoracic Surgery (cardiac surgery)
- Urology (and urologists with expertise in gender reassignment surgical procedure)
- Vascular Surgery

Staff is identifying locations to hold expert reviewer training for this calendar year. Due to the proposed change in the hourly rate for expert reviewers who attend the training, the Board is looking to hold four trainings this year (two in Northern California and two in Southern California). Trainings are scheduled to be held in August, September, October, and November.

CENTRAL COMPLAINT UNIT:

The average number of days to initiate a complaint in the Central Complaint Unit (CCU) is 11 for the third quarter of FY 2018-2019, which is one more day than the timeframe mandated by Business and Professions Code section 129(b). Management has identified efficiencies and additional staff that will assist the complaint initiation staff, which also currently has one vacancy. The average days to complete the processing of a complaint in CCU is 146 days. CCU analysts are focusing their efforts to reduce the aging of all case types.

CCU management conducted interviews for one vacant associate governmental program analyst (AGPA) position and one vacant staff services analyst (SSA) position. Both positions were filled and the employees reported for work in April. In addition to these positions, CCU currently has one vacant AGPA position in the Medical Consultant Program. Applications were received, will be reviewed and interviews will be conducted for this position.

Management is reviewing the processes in the CCU Medical Consultant Program and finding ways to streamline the process and ways to automate portions of the process. In addition, the Medical Consultant manual and guidelines are being revised, as well as the information that is submitted to the medical consultants.

COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION OFFICE:

The Complaint Investigation Office (CIO) non-sworn investigators currently have a case load of approximately 53 cases each. Since the last enforcement summary, CIO has closed 79 cases and has transmitted 30 cases to the Attorney General's Office (AGO) - 13 criminal conviction cases, 2 malpractice cases, 5 petitions for reinstatements of licensure, and 10 consumer complaints regarding failure to produce medical records. Additionally, one case was referred for a public letter of reprimand.

DISCIPLINE COORDINATION UNIT:

Pursuant to Senate Bill 1448 (Hill, Chapter 570), standardized language for public disclosure screens was drafted and submitted for approval. Upon approval, staff in the Discipline Coordination Unit (DCU) will begin drafting public disclosure summaries for physicians on probation to be posted on July 1, 2019.

DCU management is currently recruiting to fill two vacant SSA positions and one office technician (OT) position. A conditional offer of employment was made to fill one SSA position. Interviews for the second SSA position are scheduled for late April.

PROBATION UNIT:

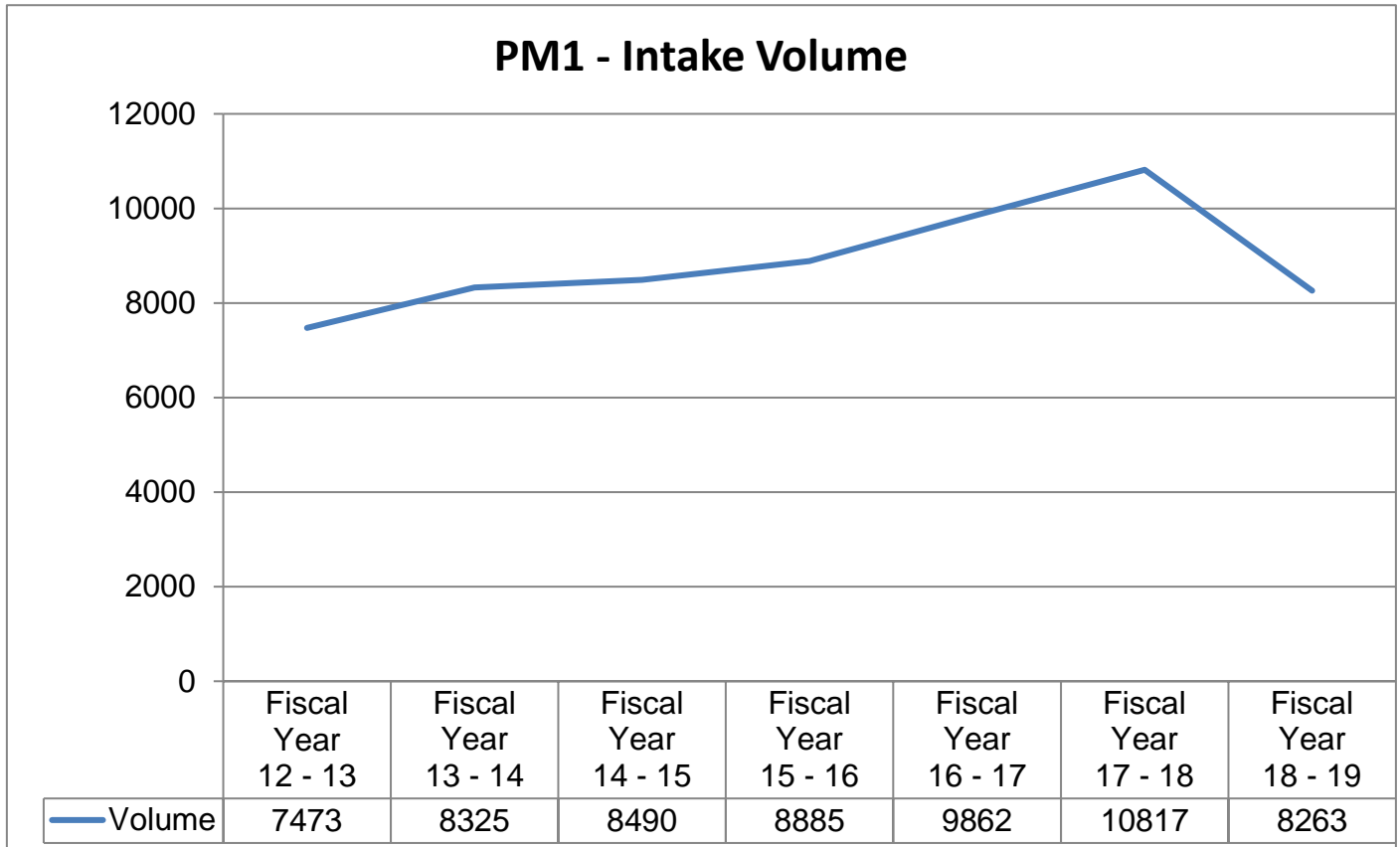
The Probation Unit currently has four vacant Inspector positions. Three positions have been advertised. Interviews were conducted for one limited-term Inspector I position in the Sacramento office and a conditional offer of employment has been made.

Fingerprint clearance and medical evaluation for that applicant is pending. Applications are being reviewed for one Inspector II position in the Glendale office and interviews are expected to be held the first week of May. A second Inspector I position in Sacramento has been advertised and the final filing date is mid-April. Interviews for this position are expected to be held the first week of May. The remaining Inspector vacancy, which is a limited-term position, is in the Cerritos office; however, the permanent incumbent is expected to return to the position by the middle of May.

ENFORCEMENT PERFORMANCE MEASURES:

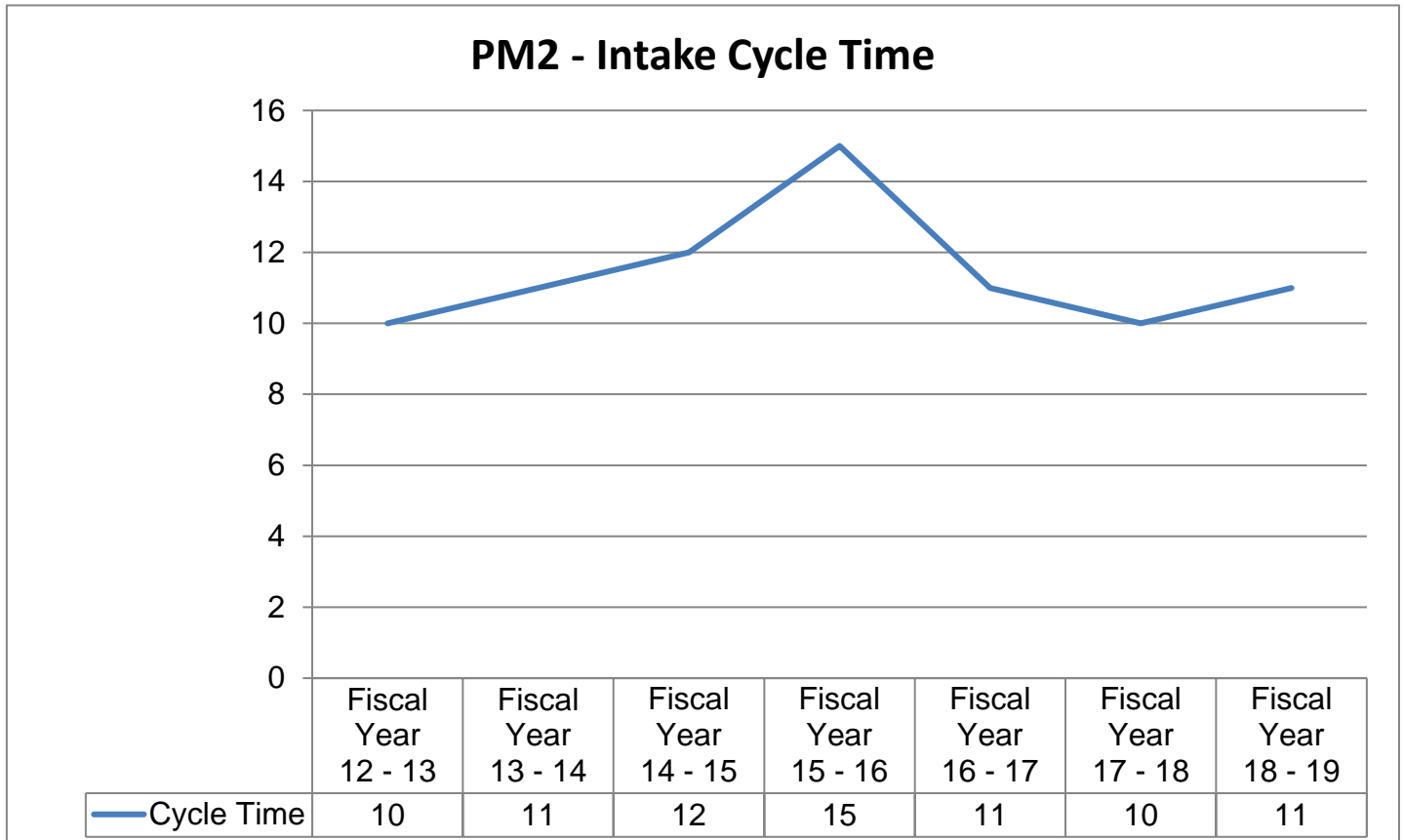
The charts on the following pages depict workload statistics regarding the number of complaints received, which includes complaints and arrest notifications (PM1), the average number of days to initiate a complaint and assign it to an analyst (PM2), the average number of days it takes to complete a case that has not been transmitted to the AGO for disciplinary action (PM3), and the average number of days it takes to complete a case that has been transmitted to the AGO for disciplinary action (PM4). PM7 captures the average number of days from when a probation inspector is assigned a case to when the inspector makes the initial telephone call to the probationer to set up the face-to-face intake interview. PM8 captures the average number of days from when a probation inspector confirms/supports with evidence that a violation of a term and condition of probation may have occurred to when management has provided approval for appropriate action to be taken for the violation of probation. Reports capturing PM7 and PM 8 statistics were implemented in July 2016, so only fiscal years 16/17 and 17/18 are reflected. Additionally, all statistics for fiscal year 18/19 only reflect from July 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019.

PM1 - Intake Volume**



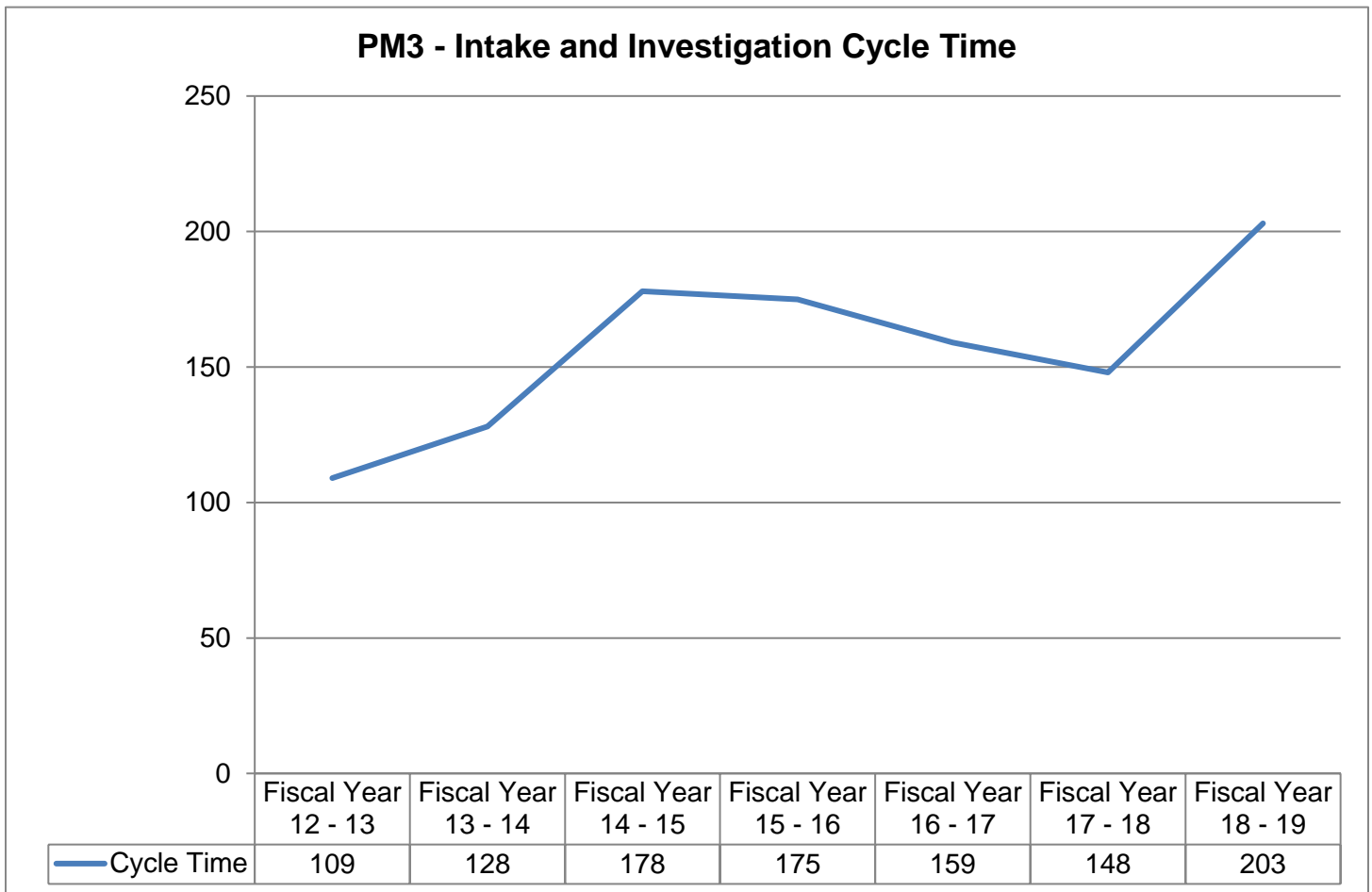

PM2 - Intake Cycle Time**



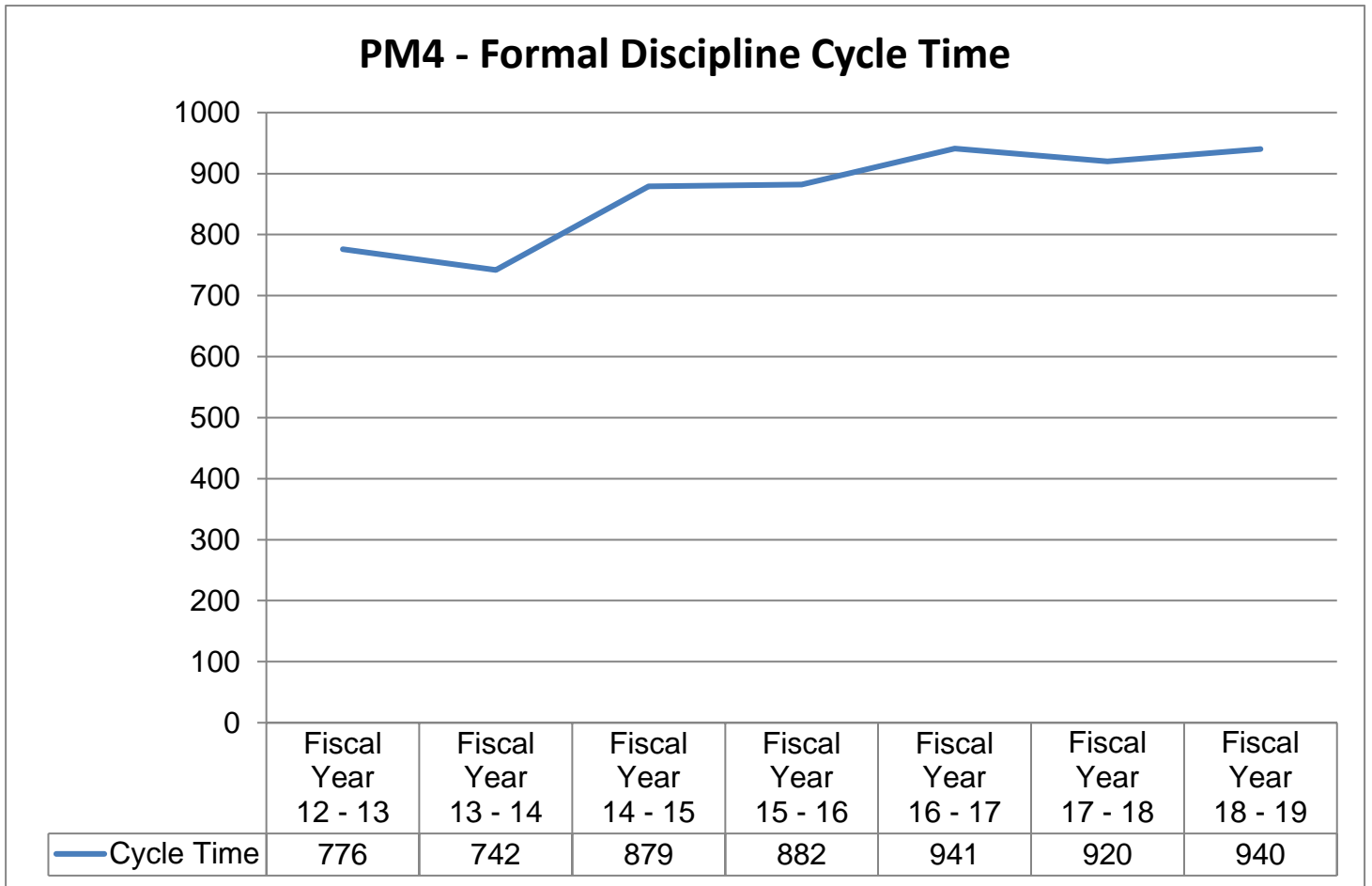

PM3 - Intake and Investigation Cycle Time**



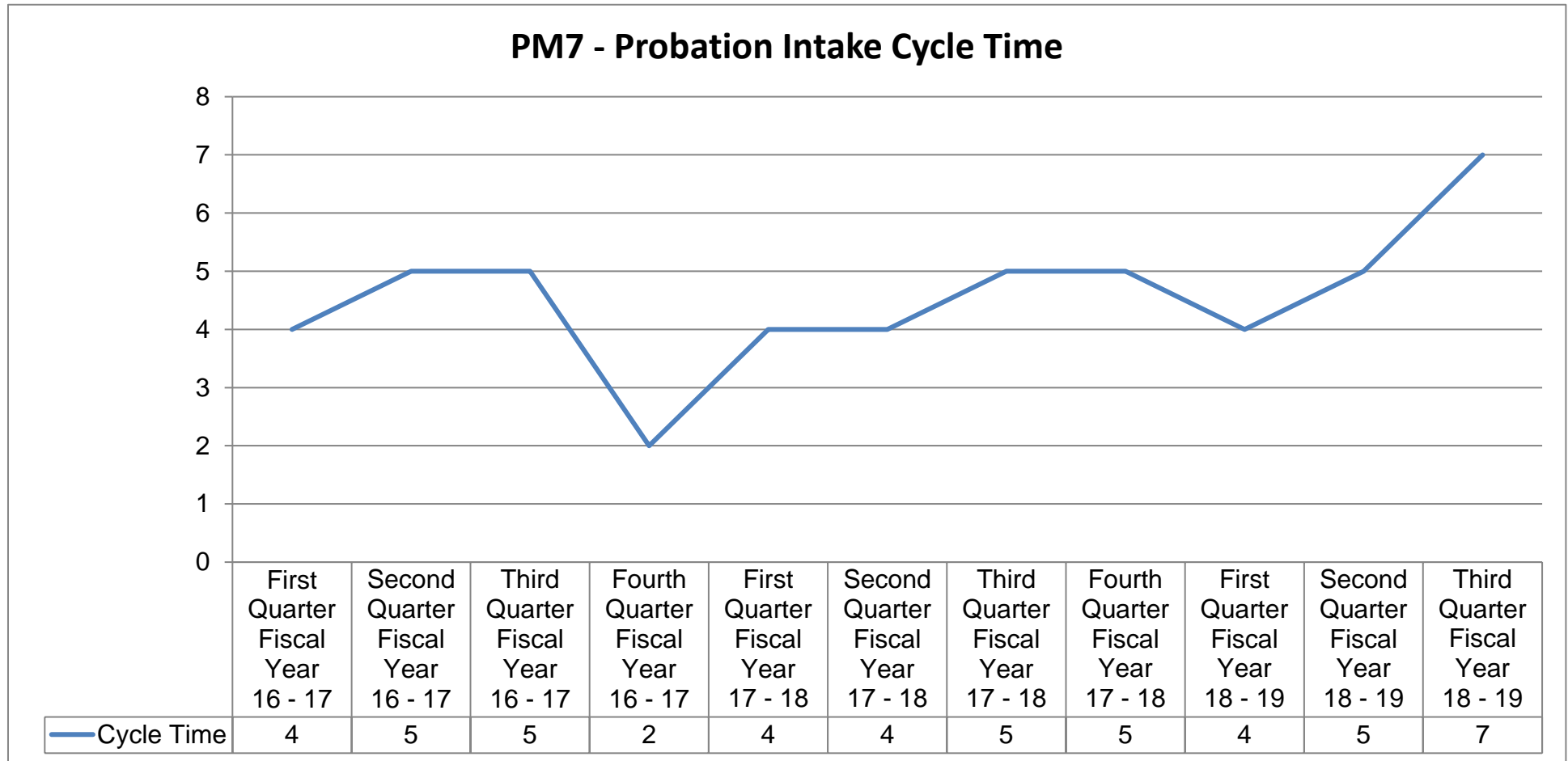

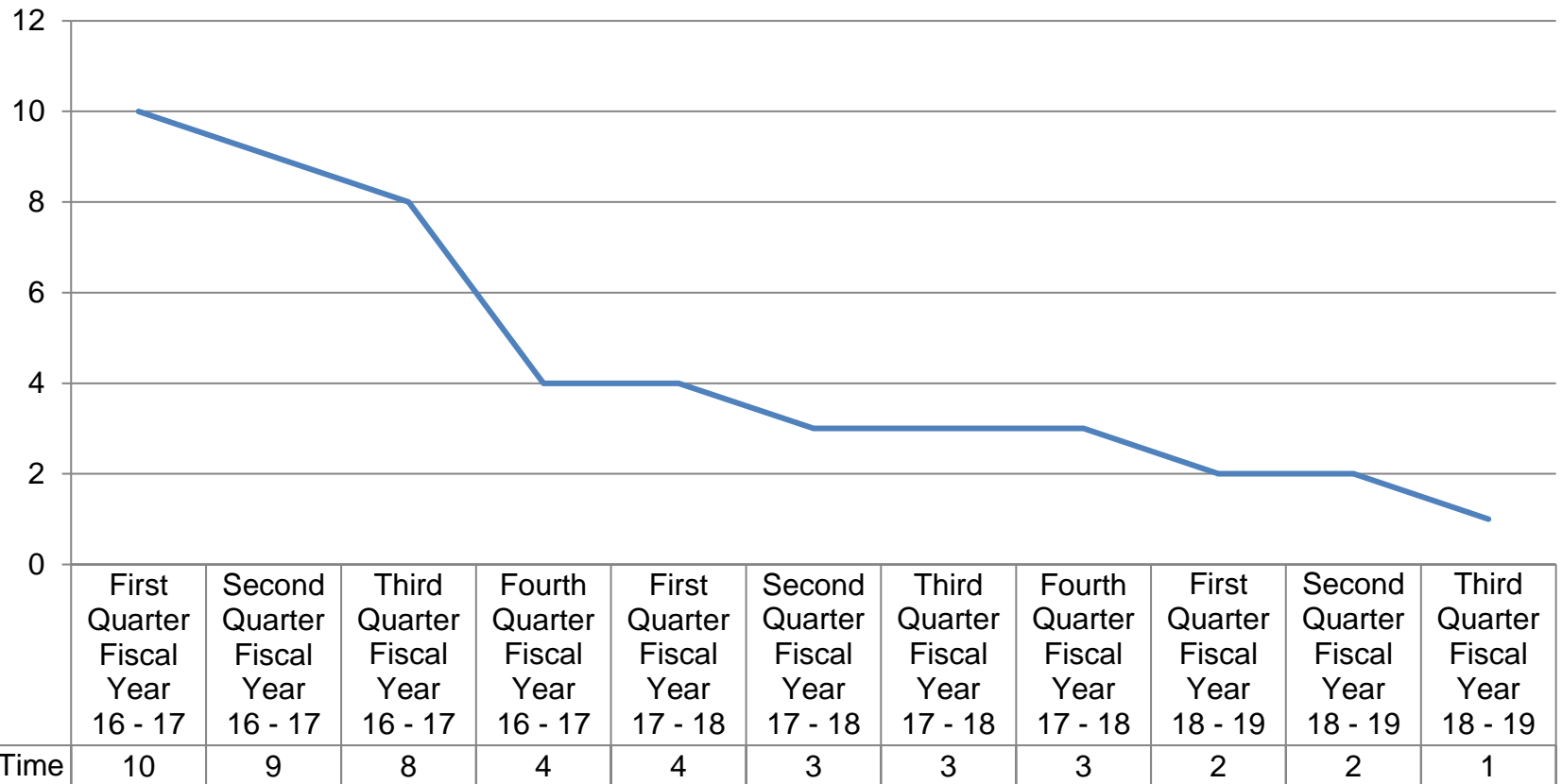

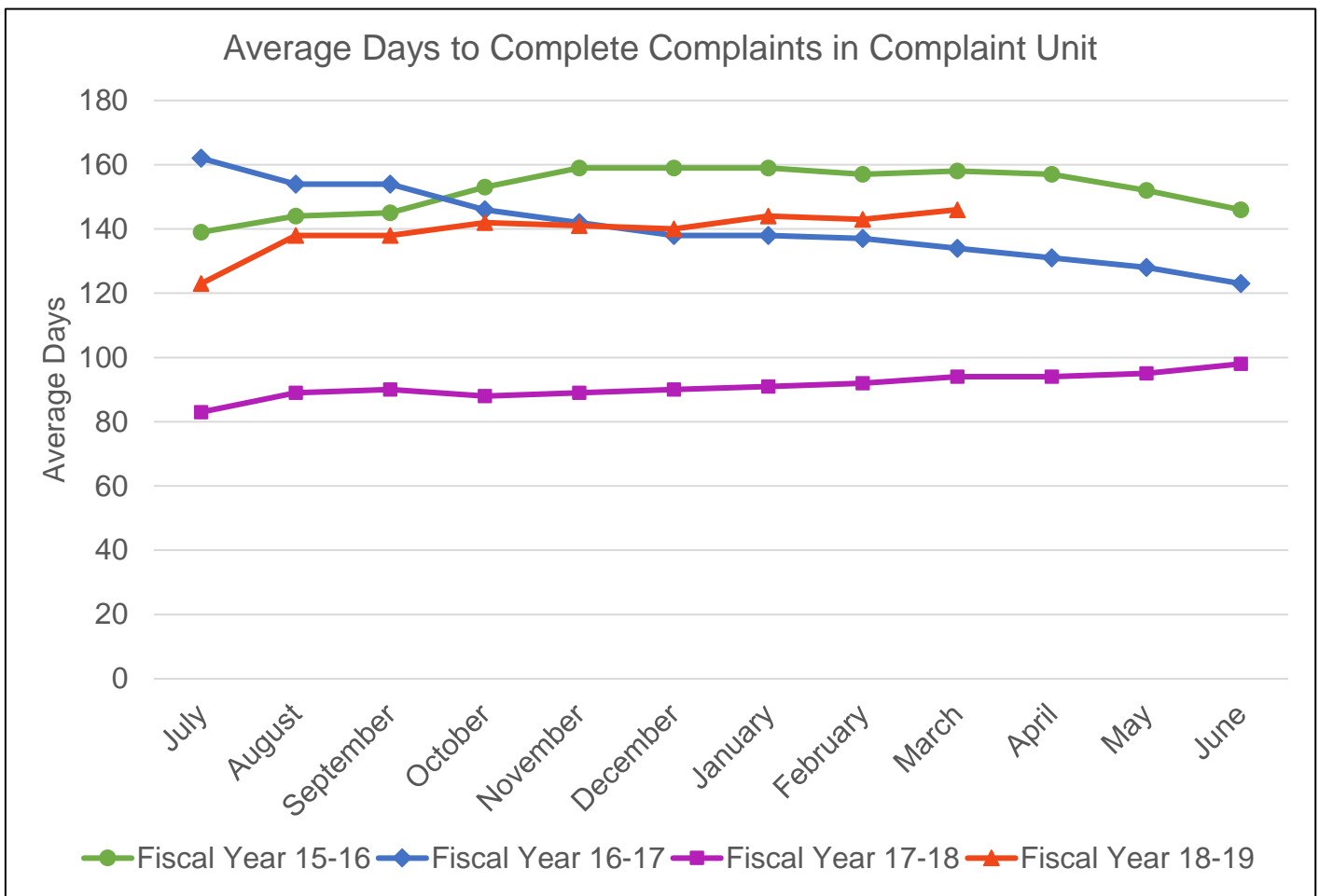

Average Days to Complete Complaint in Complaint Unit**

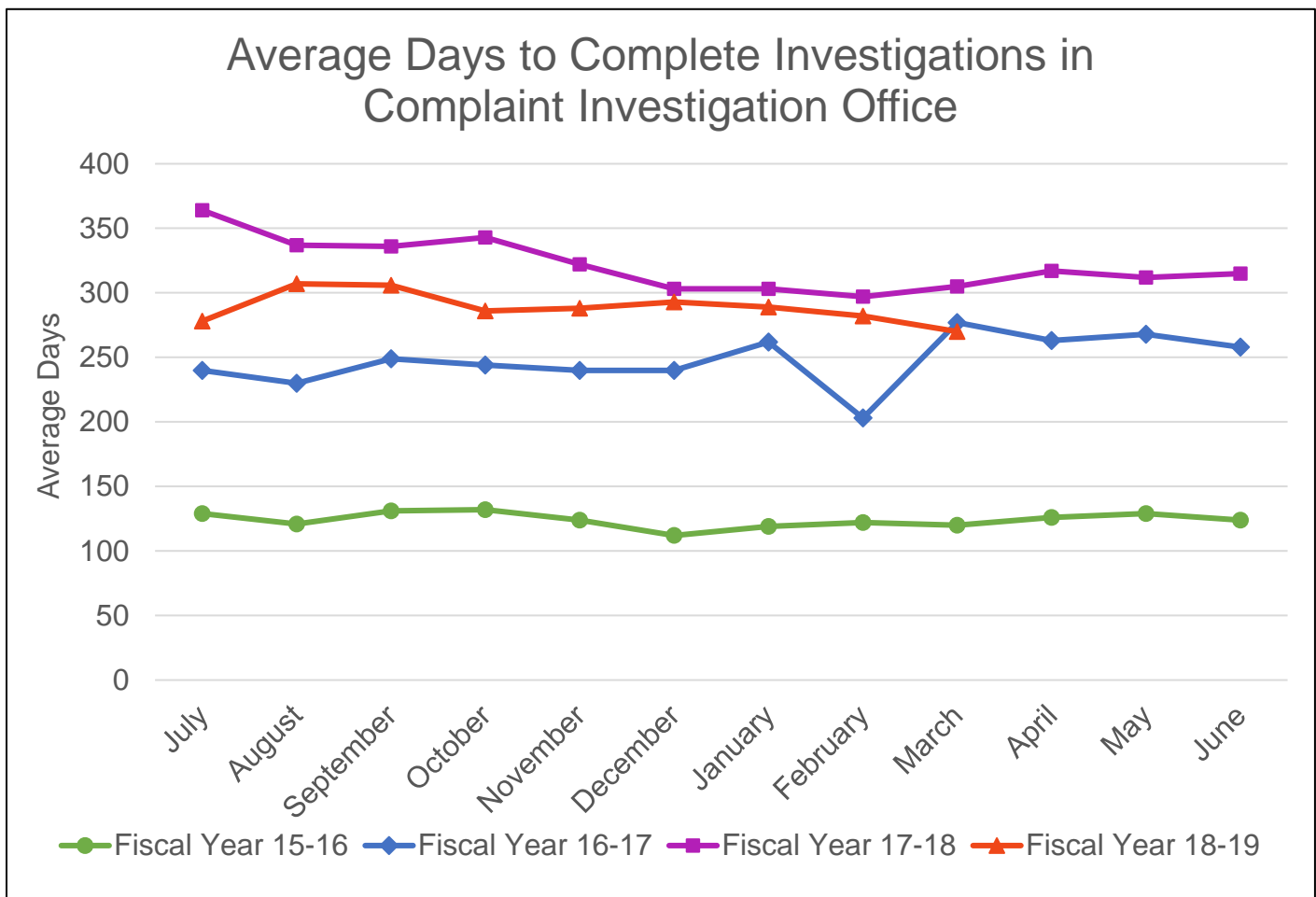

Average Days to Complete Investigations in Complaint Investigations Office

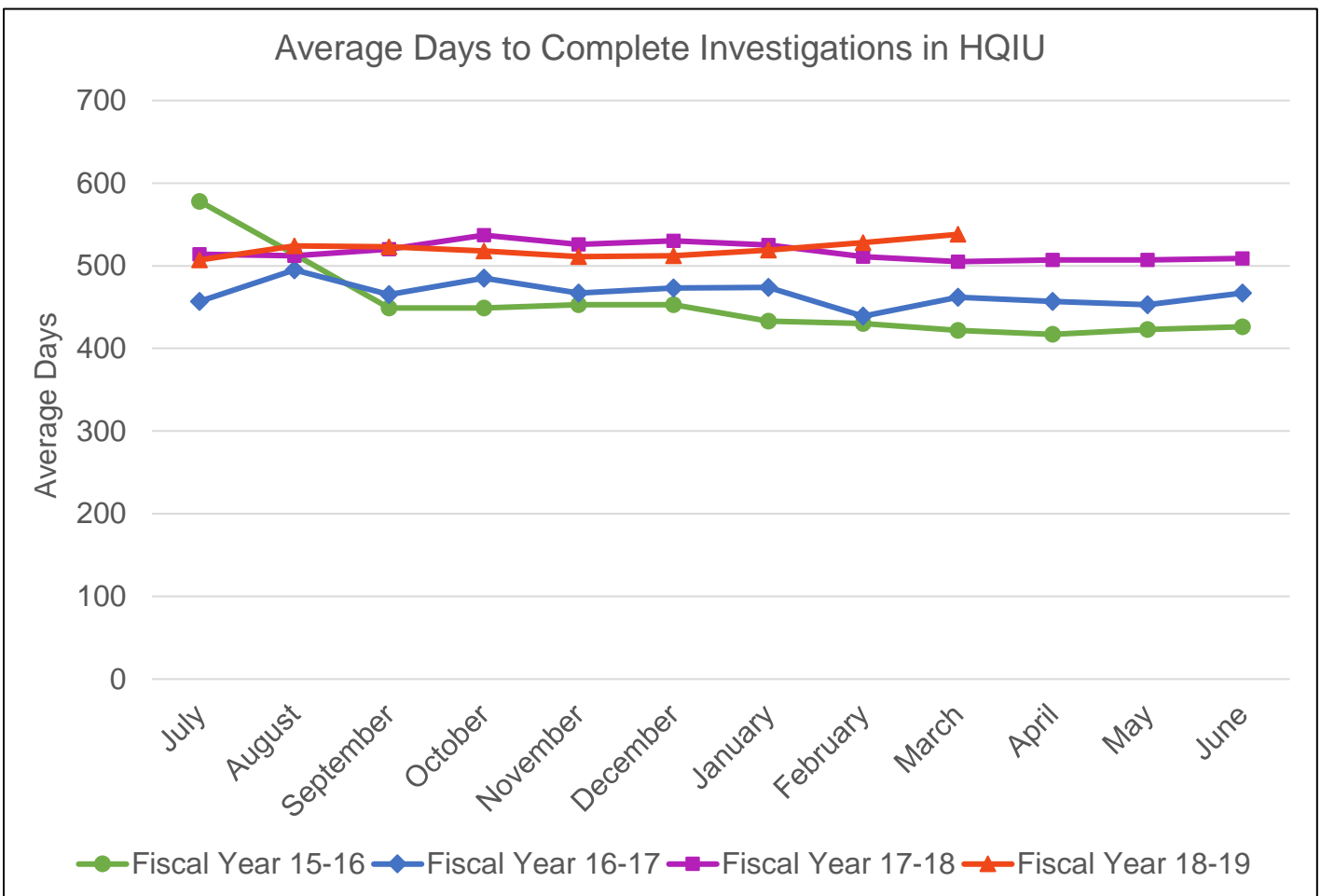

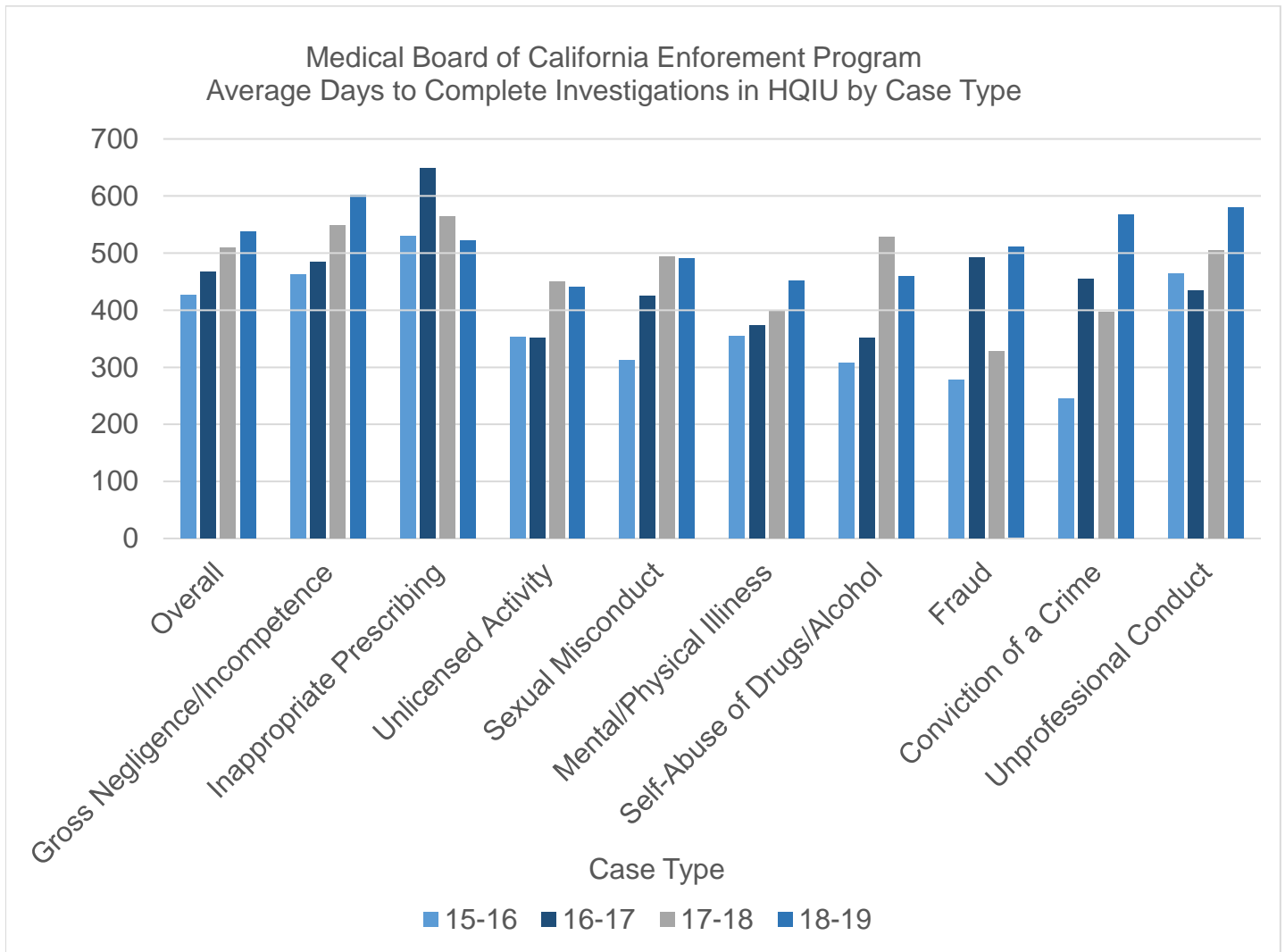

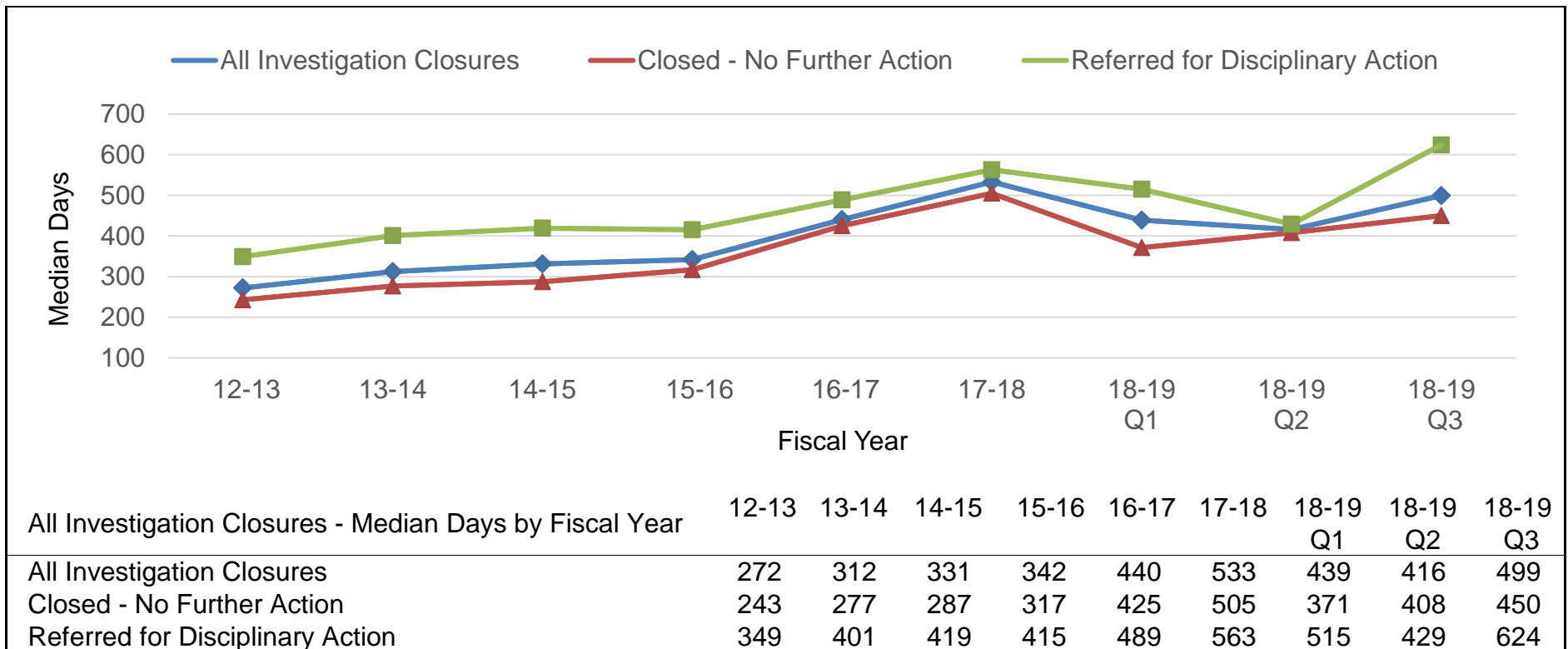

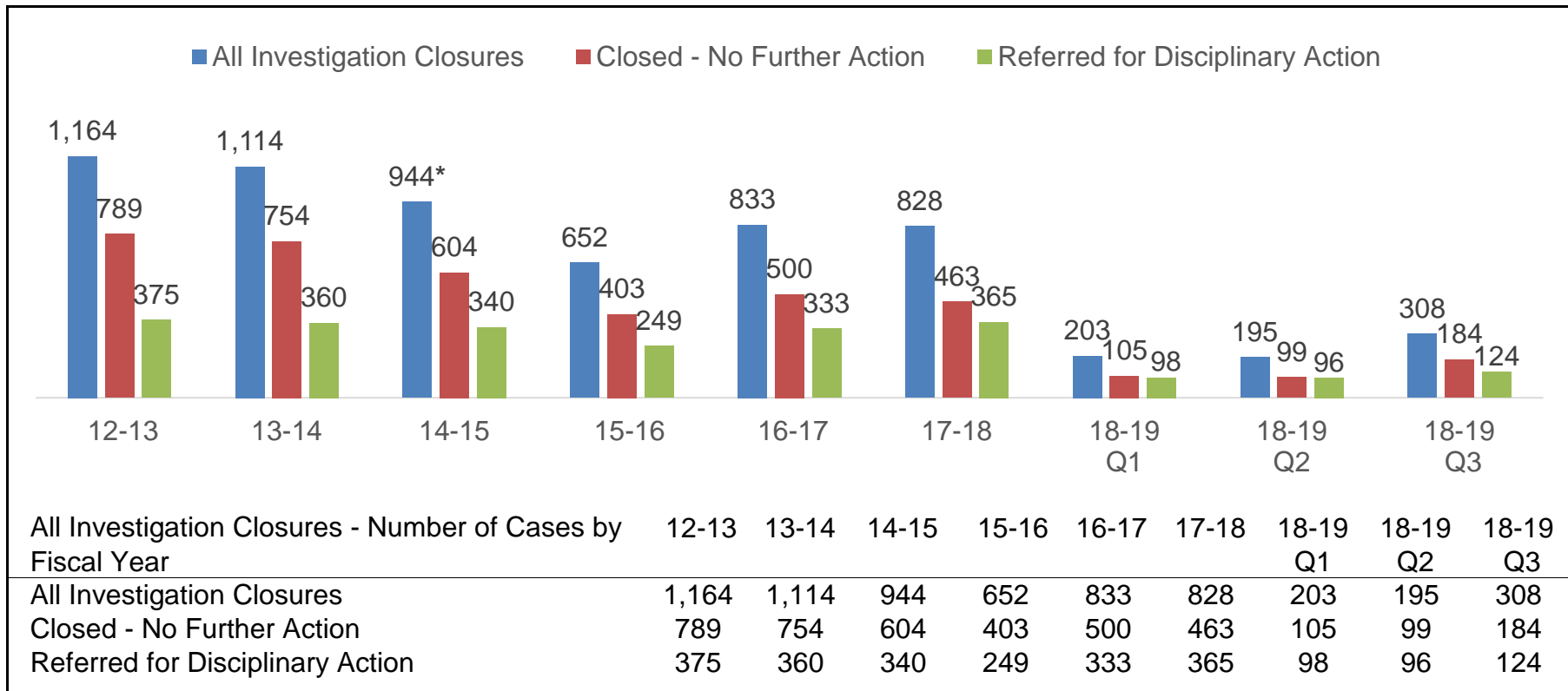
All Investigation Closures - Median Days*

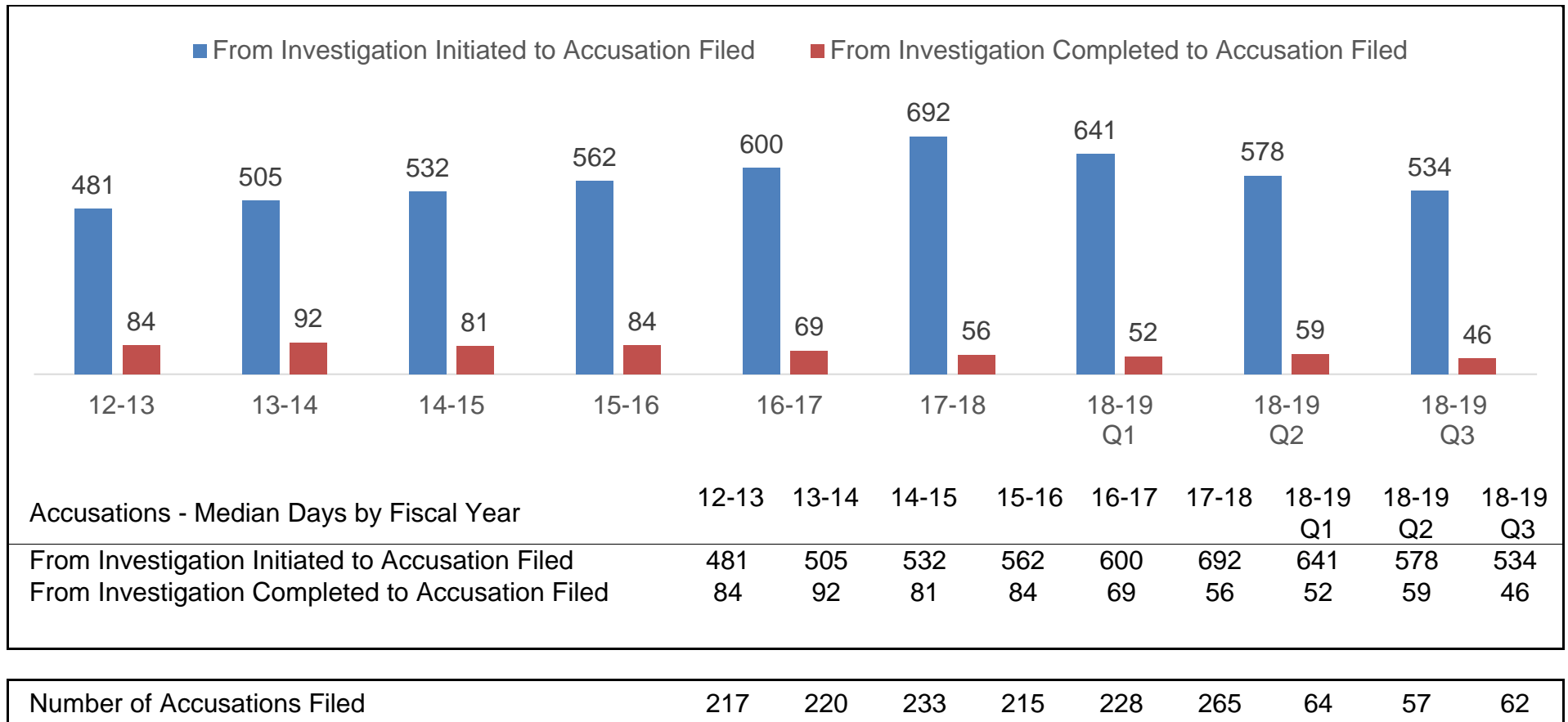
All Investigation Closures - Number of Cases

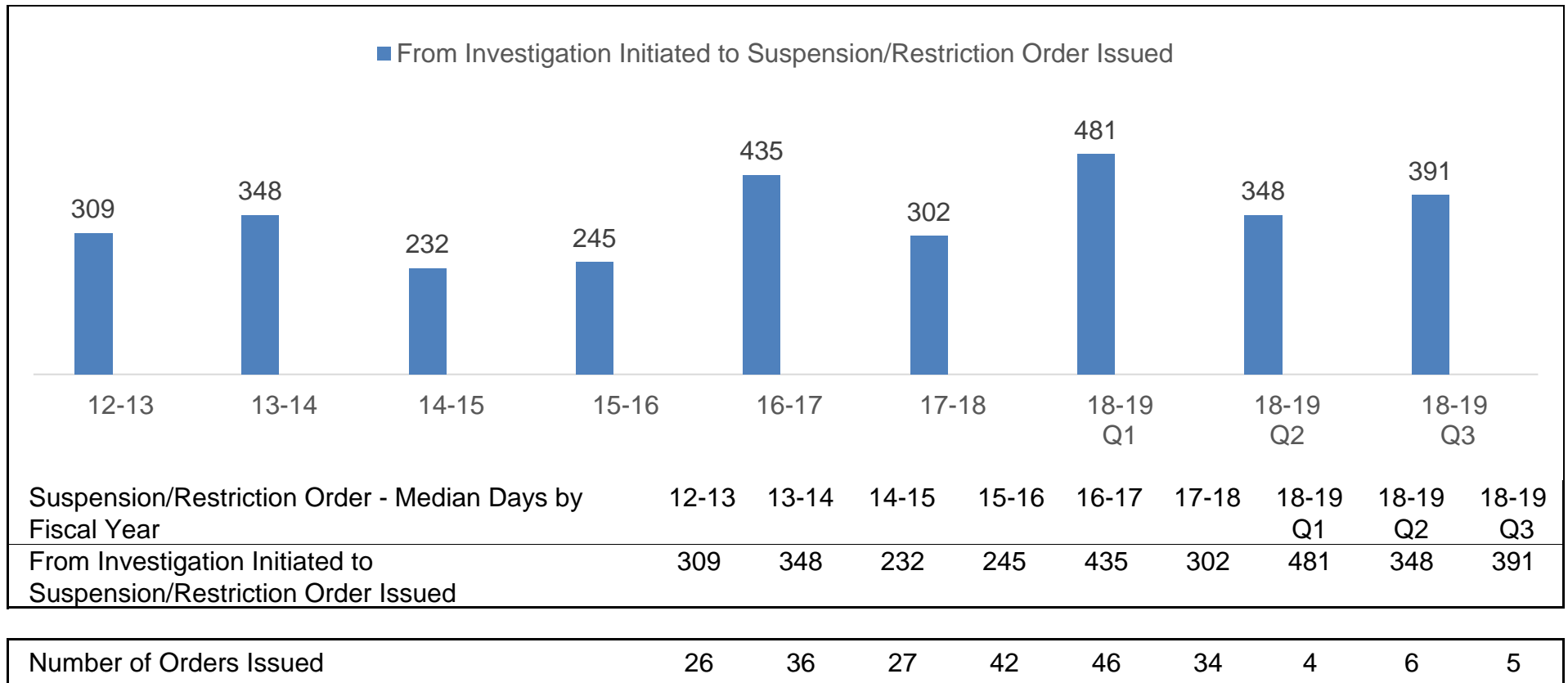

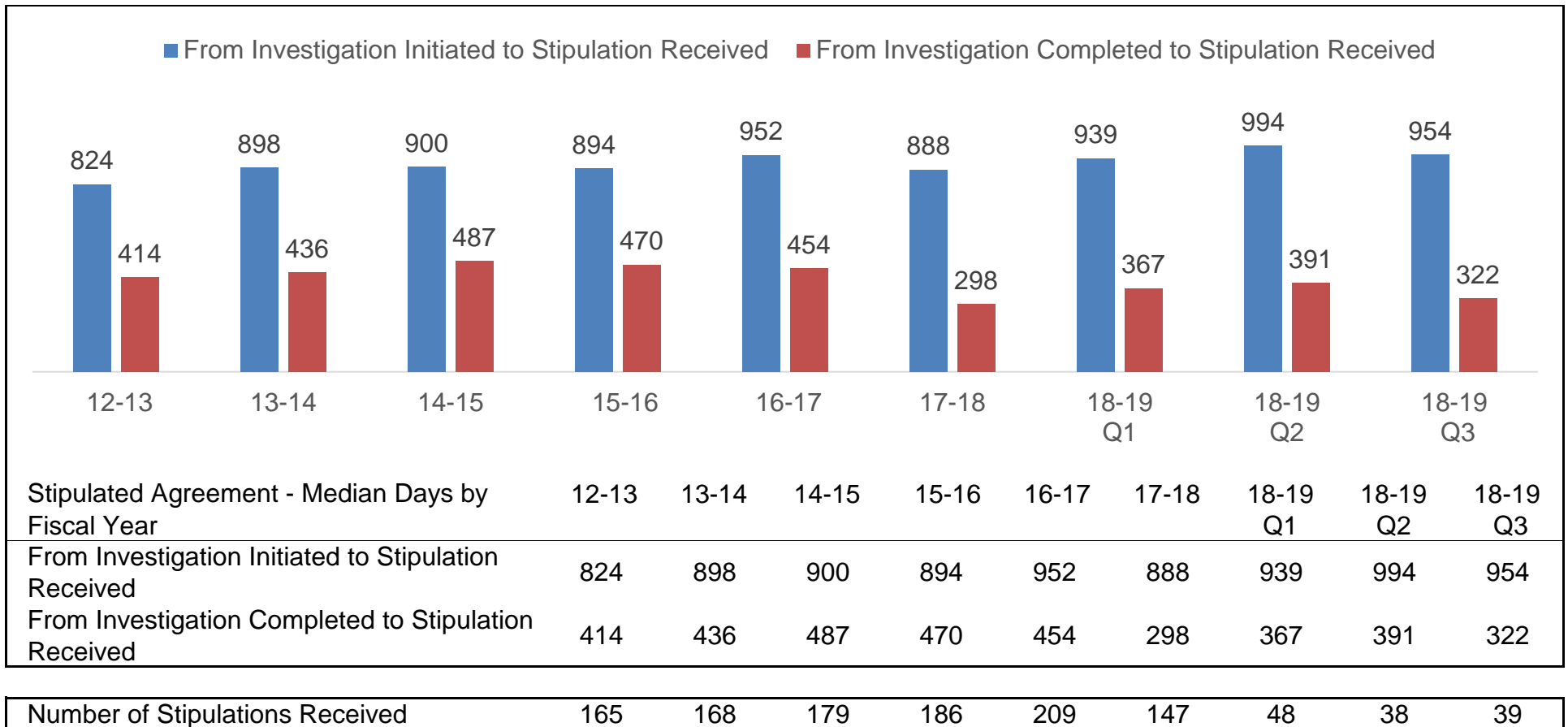
Suspension/Restriction Order - Median Days*

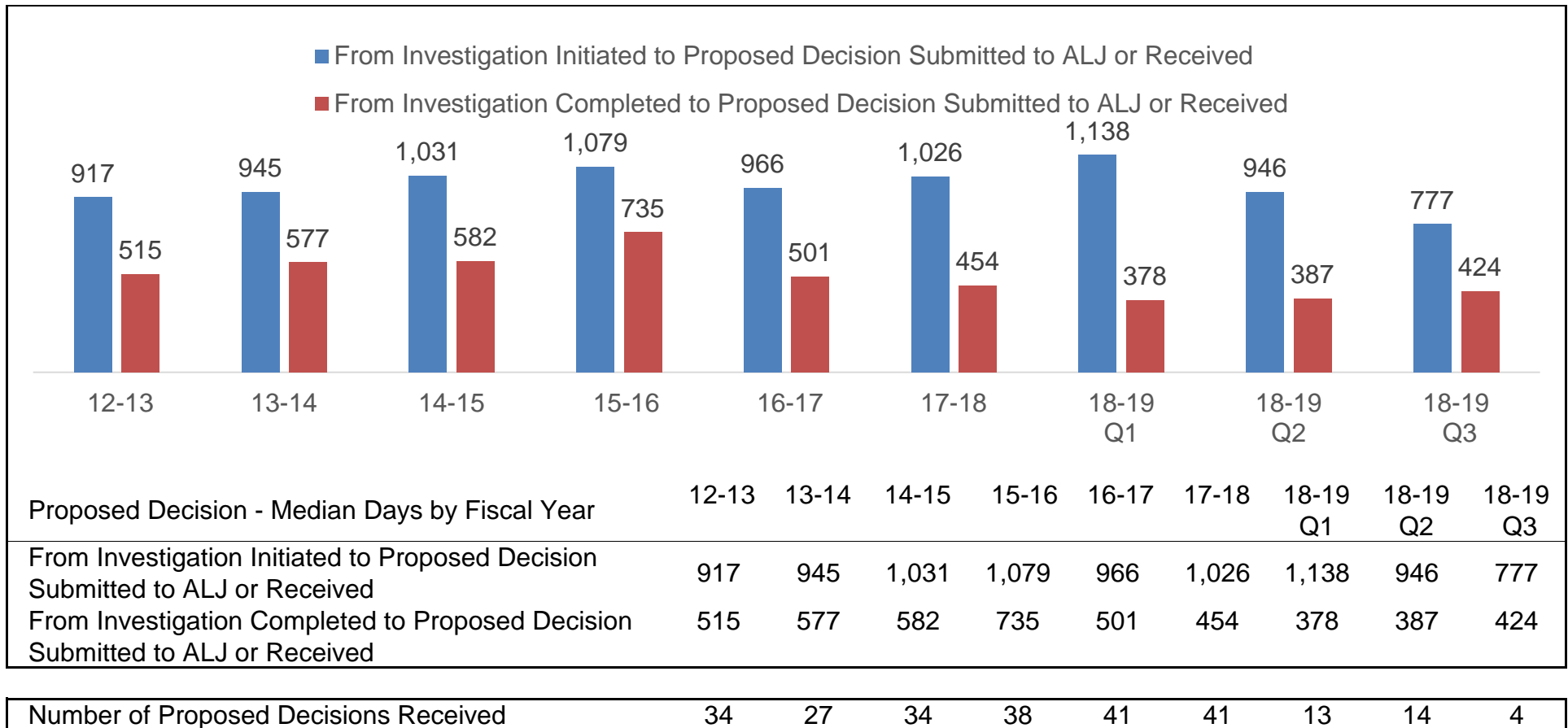

Stipulated Agreement - Median Days



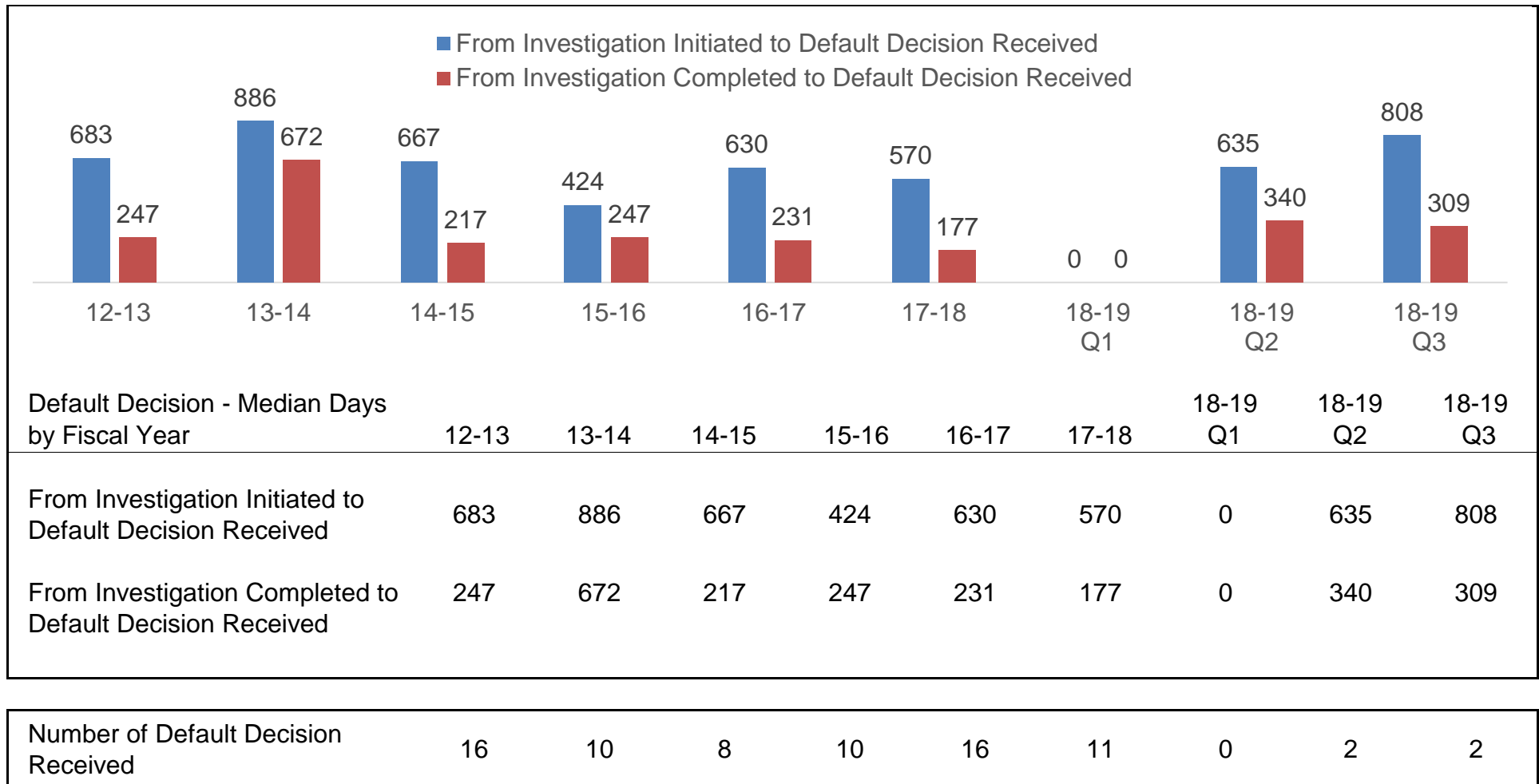
