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

To Whom It May Concern,

Thank you for considering my application for the public position on the Midwifery Advisory Council.

I am a Doctor of Chiropractic, Doula, and Birth Justice Activist.

As a Doctor of Chiropractic: I have an exclusive perinatal practice at Full Moon Birth and Family Wellness Center in Santa Cruz, California. (My office is next to the birth room!)

I am one of the original providers invited to join Full Moon prior to the center opening over five years ago. I supported activist work in acquiring zoning for the first independent birth center (where babies are birthed) in Santa Cruz County.

I was originally licensed as a chiropractor in 1998. I chose to specialize exclusively in perinatal after birthing my son, least at home, in 2008.

I have a Bachelor of Arts in English, and have worked as a professional writer in the past. Most recently, my article, "What is Birth Failure Language?" was published in *Pathways to Family Wellness* Magazine.

To my knowledge, I am one of a handful of chiropractors in the country — fewer than three dozen in the world — with an exclusive perinatal practice.

As a Doula: My first "official" Doula birth was a homebirth in 1989. I was 18 years old. I now support both home and hospital births.

Both my chiropractic and Doula practices center on supporting clients with biomechanical factors that may influence uterine alignment. This includes working with clients with breech and posterior bables. I also concentrate on supporting clients planning vaginal births after cesarean (VBACs), multiples and high-risk pregnancies.

In addition, I focus on supporting clients with a history of trauma, LGBTQIA+ clients, and neurodivergent clients. (I am a member of all three communities: Survivor of medical trauma, gay, and on the Autism spectrum!)

As an Activist: My activist work is extensive. I am particularly focused on VBAC rights, promotion of trauma-informed care, education of true informed consent and refusal, and advancing inclusive and anti-racist policies.

Much of my recent activist work centers on changing guidelines, policies and legislation that will mandate hospitals never again restrict supporting Doulas and transporting midwives. In this capacity, I am a founding member of the Doulas Are Essential Project.

More about me:

I am a third-generation homebirth worker. My mother is a retired homebirth midwife and birthing rights activist. My great-aunt was a homebirth nurse midwife in England during World War II.

The first birth I attended was my brother, born at home on Stanford campus, California, in 1973. I was 18 months old. When I was six years old, I helped support the birth of my brother, born at home in Newton, Massachusetts. He was over 10 pounds. I watched as our midwife expertly managed a shoulder dystocia with positional maneuvers. Our midwife asked me to call time of birth. (Thankfully, my parents had an early digital clock on their bedroom dresser!)

I birthed my son, at the at home in Savannah, Georgia, in 2008. There was no licensure for homebirth midwives in Georgia. Local hospitals were extremely hostile to homebirth transports. I know first-hand the dangerous public health ramifications of lack of collaboration between home and hospital providers.

Here are some of my skills I can bring to the table moving forward:

I am skilled at respectful confrontation and conflict resolution. I know how to engage in meaningful and purposeful conversations between home and hospital providers. I am passionate about interprofessional communication. I can help explain to medical providers why collaboration with midwives will save lives. Having worked as a professional writer in the past, I can help with written communication as well.
