POSITION: Neutral

DESCRIPTION OF CURRENT LEGISLATION

Prohibits the Board of Behavioral Sciences, Board of Psychology, and the Veterinary Medical Board from publicly disclosing the address of record of their licensees, except for the related city, state, county, and zip code.

SB 373 has not been amended since the prior meeting of the Medical Board of California (Board).

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to <u>Business and Professions Code (BPC) section 27</u>, many boards and bureaus within the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA), including the Board, must publish the address of record provided by their licensee on the internet. The Board meets this requirement through the <u>license lookup service</u> available through the Board's website.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

According to the author's fact sheet:

"...mental health providers play an important role in our society and as we are experiencing a workforce shortage in this industry, we need to ensure that we are providing a safe environment for licensees to be able to conduct their work and

support children and families¹. SB 373 seeks to lift the burden that all mental health professionals have to take in both costs and time to acquire a P.O. Box if they do not want to share their personal address."
