- Discussion on expanding scope of practice for midwives to include one year of postpartum care;
- Received report from Task Force on action regarding legislative solution to address stalemate on creating regulations for Licensed Midwives;
- Voted to accept the revisions to the Practice Guidelines for California Licensed Midwives.
