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Medical Board of California Revokes Hayward Physician's License

Sacramento – The Medical License of Brenda Ann Lewis has been revoked by the Medical Board of California (Board).

An Accusation was filed against Lewis on November 20, 2014, charging her with unprofessional conduct, gross negligence, repeated negligent acts, incompetence, altering medical records and inadequate medical record keeping, with regards to two patients. Lewis failed to file a Notice of Defense regarding these charges within the time frame authorized in <u>Government Code Section</u> <u>11506</u>.

Because she failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days of the Accusation, she effectively waived her rights to a hearing on the merits of the Accusation. Therefore, a default decision was issued and Brenda Ann Lewis' license was revoked effective May 29, 2015. <u>View document</u>.
