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Accusation Filed Against Los Angeles / Glendale Physician For Sexual Misconduct And Excessive Prescribing

On March 8, 2016, an Accusation and Petition To Revoke the Probation of Dr. Manasseh C. Nwaigwe was filed. The Accusation alleges sexual misconduct, prescribing without an appropriate exam, and gross negligence.

On February 17, 2016, an Interim Suspension Order (ISO) was ordered against the Los Angeles/Glendale physician. The Medical Board of California (Board) petitioned for the ISO based on concerns for public safety after an investigation exposed an alleged sexual assault in addition to several instances of alleged overprescribing to patients. The ISO took effect immediately.

A Board expert determined that allowing Dr. Nwaigwe to continue to practice medicine would be a threat to the health and safety of the consumers of the State of California. A declaration was obtained from the alleged victim regarding the assault. In addition, the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) did several undercover visits after getting a tip regarding improper prescribing. Agents were prescribed a number of narcotics without physical examinations or medical histories. Pursuant to the ISO, Dr. Nwaigwe cannot practice medicine, cannot be present at any location maintained for the purpose of practicing medicine, and cannot advertise or hold himself out as practicing or available to practice medicine, pending the outcome of an administrative hearing on the alleged violations.

Dr. Nwaigwe was previously placed on three years' probation on October 23, 2014, for a conviction for failing to file income tax returns.
