Anaheim Physician Surrenders License to Practice Medicine

SACRAMENTO – The Medical Board has adopted the stipulated surrender of Clyde M. Ikuta's license to practice medicine in the state of California, effective January 19, 2017. "The Medical Board's primary mission is public protection and this action reflects the Board's ongoing commitment to that mission," said the Board's executive director Kimberly Kirchmeyer.

In summary, on July 1, 2016, an Accusation was filed against Ikuta. The Accusation was based on the care and treatment provided to three separate patients. The Accusation contained seven causes of discipline including gross negligence, repeated negligent acts, prescribing controlled substances without prior examinations, and failure to maintain adequate and accurate records.
